As reported in our last Newsletter Adesuwa e.V. has decided to augment our school attendance and educational program with additional food packages due to the on-going economic recession in Nigeria. In workshops with Kecci and Sander the children learned in a playful way how they can minimize the danger of malnutrition even with scarce food supplies. Then each of our Adesuwa children and their families who participated in the workshop received a package with several kilograms of rice and beans.

Preventing malnutrition is essential – not only to strengthen their bodies and their resistance to disease, but also to give them the energy they need to participate actively in their school lessons
